

- Earn a GPA of 2.50 or better in all courses taken for and transferred in to the content area major (minimum 16 credit hours)

GPA Requirements:

- Earn an overall cumulative GPA of 2.75 or greater in all courses taken at and transferred to North Central College
- Earn a GPA of 3.00 or better in all courses taken for and transferred in to the Secondary Education major
- Earn a GPA of 2.50 or better in all courses taken for and transferred in to the content area major

Progression Point 3: Licensure

*Pass EDUC 492 Pre-Residency Seminar, EDUC 494 Student Teaching Residency Seminar, and EDUC 496 Student Teaching Residency with a grade of C- or better

- *Earn a passing Score on the edTPA teacher performance assessment
- *Complete all other necessary requirements to earn a bachelor's degree
- * Illinois State Board of Education requirement enforced by North Central College
